## I Program Overview

- Title : 2025 CPI Global Connect Workshop
- Objective: To foster cross-cultural collaboration among international cultural professionals and strengthen sustainable networks between Korea and participating countries.
- Schedule: September 1 (Mon) – September 14 (Sun), 2025
  - \* Two-week program, 5 days per week / Dates subject to change
- Format : On-site workshop in Korea
- Theme : Cultural Convergence in the Digital Era – Technology and Digital Transformation
  - \* Examples: VR performances, AI-generated artworks or music, interactive media art

- Applications must be submitted by the deadline:  
June 15, 2025 (Sun), 24:00 KST.  
*\* Submissions received after the deadline will not be accepted under any circumstances*
- All documents must be completed using the designated templates.  
*\* Applications with missing documents or incorrect formats may be excluded from evaluation*
- Only include professional experience that can be verified with supporting documentation.
- Interview schedules will be arranged only for applicants who pass the document screening.  
*\* Failure to attend the scheduled interview will be considered a voluntary withdrawal from the selection process*

### ▶ Travel and Stay

- Round-trip airfare and accommodation will be provided only for the official program period.  
*\* Personal extensions before or after the program are not eligible for support*
- Participants are responsible for all personal expenses, including:
  - Meals outside official program hours (e.g., dinners, weekends)
  - Visa issuance and related fees
  - Travel insurance*\* Participants must purchase their own travel insurance and submit proof prior to departure*
