Each session, led by expert instructor Hyekyung Choi, will provide insights into the fascinating stories behind these games, fostering a deeper understanding of their cultural context.

Participants will have the chance to create their own versions of these traditional games and experience the joy of playing them together. Instructor Choi will guide attendees through the historical and cultural significance of each game, emphasising their role as symbols of Korean heritage.

The KCCUK is committed to promoting Korean traditional culture and history through innovative and engaging events. The 'K-Creative Sessions' are a testament to this commitment, offering a platform for cultural exchange and fostering closer connections between the UK and Korea.
